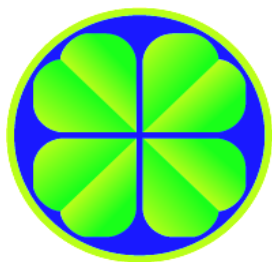

NSPCC - Speak Out, Stay Safe

To support our PSHE curriculum, two specially trained staff from the NSPCC delivered age appropriate assemblies to the children this week. In Reception and Key Stage One, the children explored their right to speak out and who they could talk to if they didn't feel safe. In Key Stage Two, the children explored children's rights and worries and learnt what happens when a child contacts Childline.
