

Suggested activities:

1. Play a memory game with the Olympics sports cards: cut them out, muddle them up, and turn them all face-down. Take it in turns with a partner to turn over two cards at a time. If you turn over a matching word and picture, you may keep the cards. If the word and picture don't match, you must turn the cards back over again. The winner is the player who matches the most cards.
2. Shuffle the Olympics sports cards (words) – then use a stopwatch to time how long it takes you to put them all in alphabetical order. See if you can improve your time.
3. Design a logo for each Olympic sport on the worksheet provided.
4. Sort the Olympic sports cards into categories (e.g. water sports, ball sports). How many different categories can you think of?
5. Imagine you have met an alien from outer space. Write an explanation of an Olympic event of your choice, so that the alien can understand how it works.
6. Research a gold medallist for an Olympic sport of your choice (e.g. Laura Trott for cycling). Write a factfile about them.
7. Select an Olympic event and list the equipment a competitor needs to participate.
8. Write a poem about your favourite Olympic sport.
9. Find out how many different types of swimming events there are, and make a bullet-pointed list.
10. Design a sports kit for an Olympic event of your choice.
11. Invent a new Olympic sport and write a set of instructions for how to play it.
12. Find out which modern Olympic events also took place at the ancient Olympics.
