Next up is... the comic catastrophe!


Up next is... interview of the week!

## Recipe of the week

### Ingredients

125g [plain flour](#)  
25g cocoa powder  
1 tsp [baking powder](#)  
1 [large egg](#)  
60g [caster sugar](#)  
2 tbsp vegetable oil  
100ml [whole milk](#)  
50g [chocolate chips \(optional\)](#)  
100g [icing sugar](#)

### STEP 1

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4.  
Line a muffin tin with six muffin cases.  
Sieve the flour, cocoa and baking powder into a medium [bowl](#). Mix together the egg, sugar, oil and milk together in a jug, then gradually pour into the dry ingredients (add chocolate chips now to make double chocolate muffins, if you like) and mix until combined.

### STEP 2

Spoon the mixture evenly into the cake cases and bake for 20-25 mins until a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Remove from the oven and leave to cool.

### STEP 3

Meanwhile, gradually mix ½-1 tbsp water into the icing sugar until you have a loose consistency that's not too runny. Drizzle the icing over the muffins once cool.
