

LIMITING THE SPREAD OF INFECTION

I'm sure you will be aware that Tasburgh and surrounding villages have a high number of Covid 19 cases at the moment. We are fortunate that, so far, this has had very little impact on children at the school. It appears that others who have been affected have had initial symptoms that are not described in the standard government guidance - many have started with a cold or sore throat, headache, sickness or diarrhoea. Because of this, we ask you not to send your child into school if they have any of these symptoms until you have tested for Covid 19. This can be done using Lateral Flow Tests which are widely available and free of charge. The latest tests require only a nasal swab, meaning they are much easier to use with children. If this test is positive a PCR will be required. If the test is negative, your child is welcome to return to school—please let the school office know that a test has been completed.

Thank you for helping to limit the spread of infection and keep us all safe.

Dear Parents

Earlier this week, I attended a school leaders' meeting to hear the latest local authority briefing about keeping schools safe during this stage of the pandemic. It was made clear that schools should not be welcoming groups of parents into their buildings at this point and that risk assessments for all contacts remain essential.

Unless this guidance changes before the end of term, this means that we won't be inviting parents to join us for our traditional Christmas celebrations. This is hugely disappointing but the good health of all our families must be our first priority.
