- Looking at the lives of significant individuals from the past.



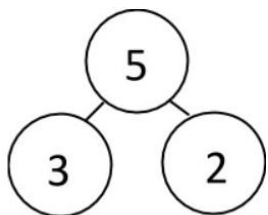
Maths

- Length, height and comparing sizes.

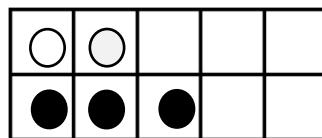
Below are the representations and models that we will be using alongside number sentences:

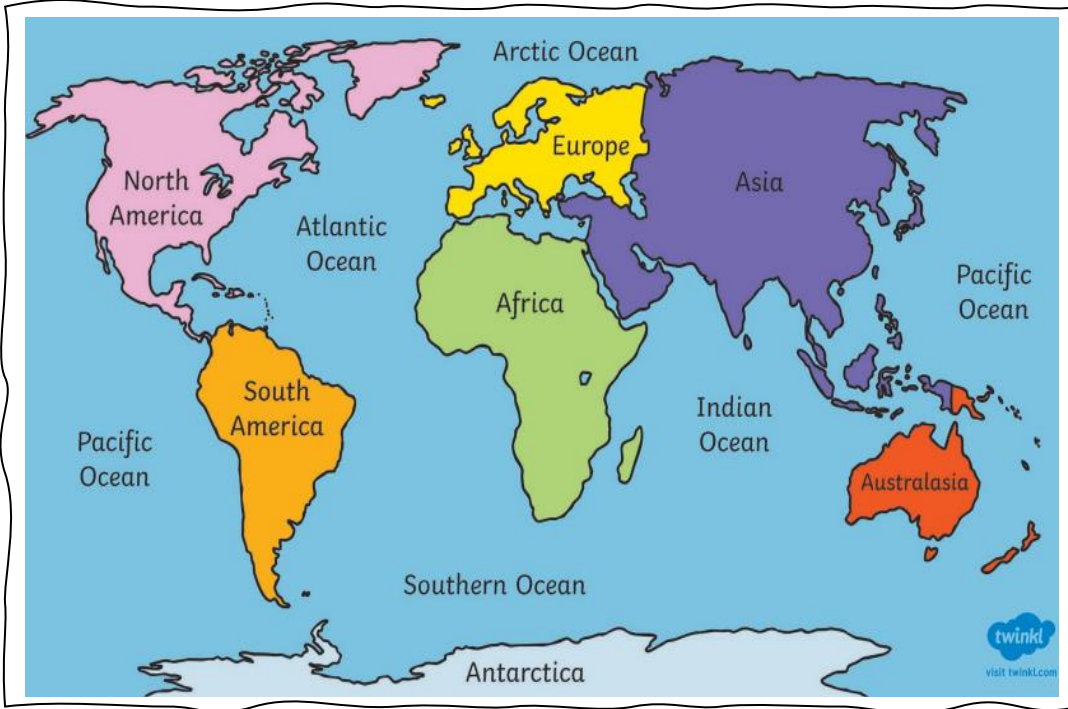

- Different materials have different uses, or properties, which make them suitable for different things.



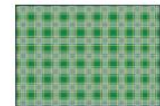
